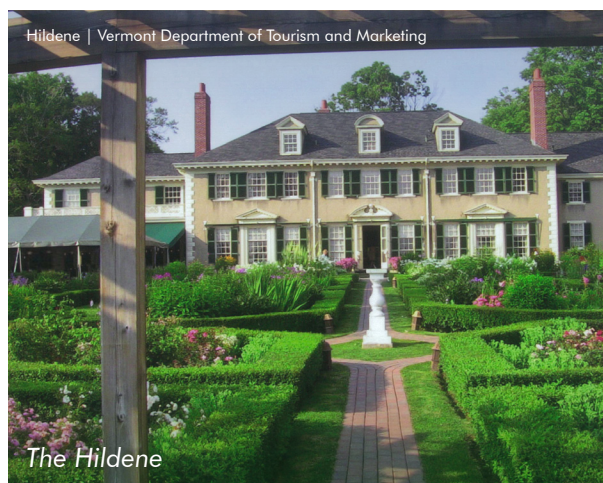

NEW ENGLAND FALL FOLIAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 SUNDAY, OCTOBER 11 BOSTON, MA (D)

Today, we will transfer to the airport for our flight to **Boston**. Upon arrival, we'll check into our hotel and settle in before gathering for a delightful welcome dinner to kick off this unforgettable journey through New England.

DAY 2 MONDAY, OCTOBER 12 GREAT BARRINGTON, MA (B, D)

This morning, step into the heart of America's revolutionary past as we embark on a captivating **"Walk into History" tour** along Boston's iconic **Freedom Trail**. Led by a knowledgeable local guide, this immersive experience winds through cobblestone streets and historic landmarks, where the stories of patriots, protests, and pivotal moments are brought vividly to life. We'll stand where history was made—at sites like the Old North Church, Paul Revere's House, and Boston Common—as our guide shares powerful tales and hidden details that bring this legendary city to life. Enjoy lunch on your own at the lively Faneuil Hall Marketplace before we continue into the scenic Berkshires. Our destination is the beloved **Norman Rockwell Museum**, home to the largest and most significant collection of the artist's original works. Stroll through galleries filled with Rockwell's poignant and playful illustrations, each capturing the spirit of American life with warmth, humor, and social commentary. After admiring Rockwell's world of nostalgic charm and cultural reflection, we'll settle into our hotel and come together for a relaxing group dinner.

DAY 3 TUESDAY, OCTOBER 13 ESSEX JUNCTION, VT (B, L)

After breakfast, journey north to the towering **Bennington Battle Monument**, the tallest structure in Vermont and a powerful tribute to a pivotal American victory during the Revolutionary War. Standing 306 feet tall and crafted from blue-gray limestone, the monument provides fascinating exhibits and statues honoring heroes such as General John Stark and Colonel Seth Warner. Our historical adventure continues at **The Hildene**, the elegant estate of Abraham Lincoln's son. Wander through its 400-acre grounds, including formal gardens, a working goat dairy, a restored 1903 Pullman railcar, and scenic walking trails, before enjoying a group lunch nearby. This afternoon, indulge in the flavors of **Vermont at Dakin Farm**, where we can sample maple syrup, cob-smoked meats, and aged cheddar, explore the sugarhouse, and learn about the time-honored traditions of sugaring (*subject to availability*). Our day ends in **Essex Junction, VT**, where we'll check into our hotel and unwind for the remainder of the evening.

DAY 4 WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 14 STOWE, VT (B, D)

Indulge in a delightfully sweet start to the day with a visit to the world-famous **Ben & Jerry's Factory**, where a behind-the-scenes tour offers a fun and flavorful look at how their iconic ice cream is made. Learn about the company's quirky history, watch the production process in action, and top it off with a scoop of your choice in the legendary Flavor Room. Don't miss a stroll through the whimsical Flavor Graveyard, where retired favorites are laid to rest with tongue-in-cheek epitaphs (*subject to availability*). Then, enjoy time for lunch on your own in Montpelier before visiting **Morse Farm Maple Sugarworks**. With over 200 years of maple-making tradition, this stop offers syrup tastings, live demonstrations, and a whimsical outdoor museum. The afternoon takes us into the scenic hills surrounding the **Von Trapp Family Lodge**, where the real-life story behind *The Sound of Music* unfolds through a family-led tour, a heartfelt documentary, and a visit to historic landmarks on the 2,600-acre estate. End the day with in **Stowe** with a memorable group dinner and a cozy hotel stay.

DAY 5 THURSDAY, OCTOBER 15 CONWAY, NH (B, L)

History, charm, and stunning scenery await as we begin our day at the majestic **Omni Mount Washington Resort & Spa**. This grand retreat, built in 1902, has hosted presidents and world leaders and was the site of the pivotal 1944 Bretton Woods Conference. Explore its stately architecture, including the famed Gold Room, and soak in breathtaking views of Mount Washington and the surrounding peaks. After a delightful group lunch, step **aboard the Conway Scenic Railroad's Mountaineer** for an unforgettable ride through the dramatic Crawford Notch. As we glide past rugged cliffs, cascading brooks, and a blaze of autumn color, we'll experience New England's fall foliage at its finest (*subject to availability*). Afterward, settle into our accommodations for a two-night stay and enjoy the evening at your leisure.

DAY 6 FRIDAY, OCTOBER 16 CONWAY, NH (B, L)

Today promises beautiful views and storybook charm, beginning with a delightful **lunch cruise aboard the M/S Mount Washington** on the sparkling waters of Lake Winnepesaukee. Savor a freshly prepared meal as we glide past majestic mountains and hidden coves, all while listening to fascinating tales of the region's history and folklore. Then, step into a mountaintop dream at **Castle in the Clouds**, an estate perched high in the Ossipee Mountains. Cap off the day in Conway, where we'll have time to explore charming shops and enjoy dinner on our own.

DAY 7 SATURDAY, OCTOBER 17 YORK, ME (B, D)

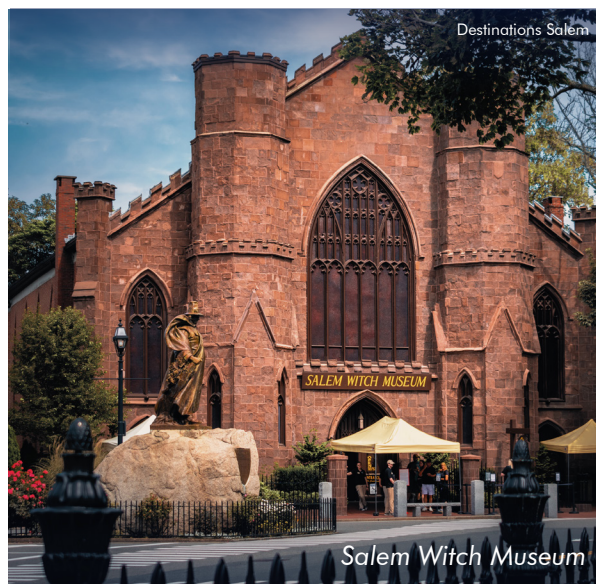
Bid farewell to Conway and head for the scenic coast of Maine, beginning with a narrated **trolley tour through Kennebunkport**. Discover over 300 years of history as we pass legendary sites like Walker's Point and the Franciscan Monastery. After lunch on our own, we continue to Ogunquit for a breathtaking **cruise to the Cape Neddick Lighthouse**, offering rare views from the water and captivating stories from the crew (*subject to availability*). Our day ends in **York**, where we'll have some free time before gathering for a memorable farewell dinner.

DAY 8 SUNDAY, OCTOBER 18 HOME (B)

As we begin our journey home, make a stop in the storied town of Salem, MA. Step into the **Salem Witch Museum**, where a dramatic presentation of life-sized sets, lighting, and narration brings the infamous 1692 witch trials to life inside a former church steeped in history (*subject to availability*). After this spooky experience, we'll continue to Boston and board our flight home.

DOCUMENTATION: A current government-issued photo ID is required for this trip. **Effective May 7, 2025: All travelers on domestic flights must have a Real ID-compliant form of identification to board. Driver's licenses with a star inside a gold circle in the upper corner are Real ID-compliant, as are passports. You can apply to get a compliant ID by visiting your local DMV.**

CANCELLATION: Full refund of all monies is made if cancellation is received in writing to Destinations with Nadine prior to final payment, less the 3% credit card transaction fee (if a credit card is used). A 100% fee is charged if the cancellation occurs between final payment and departure.

TRAVELERS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS: You must advise Destinations with Nadine (DWN) at the time of registration of any disability requiring special attention. SDI and DWN will make reasonable efforts to accommodate the special needs of travelers. The Americans with Disabilities Act is applicable only in the U.S., and accommodations outside the U.S. may be more limited. Travelers requiring assistance are required to be accompanied by a companion who is capable of, and totally responsible for, providing the assistance. Neither DWN nor SDI personnel nor its suppliers may lift or physically assist with travelers' special needs including, but not limited to, walking, dining, or other routine activities. Travelers thinking they may need assistance should call DWN to determine what accommodations may reasonably be provided. Arrangements at an additional cost are the financial responsibility of the traveler.

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It is the sole discretion of SDI and DWN to refuse transport to any passenger, or require any passenger to leave the tour, if it is reasonably believed that the passenger (1) is dangerous to others or himself or herself; (2) is engaged in or is threatening to engage in behavior that may adversely affect the safety, security, enjoyment, or well-being of other passengers, including behavior that is disruptive, verbally or physically abusive, obnoxious, harassing, or obscene; or (3) has failed or refused to follow SDI and DWN rules and procedures or the instructions of its representatives. In the event a passenger is removed, such passenger may be left at any location without any liability to SDI and DWN or its representatives. SDI and DWN shall not be required to refund any portion of the price paid by any passenger who is removed, nor shall SDI and DWN be responsible for any further expenses incurred by the passenger. SDI shall be entitled to recover from the passenger any costs or expenses incurred by SDI and DWN or its representatives in the removal of the passenger or the exercise or enforcement of this clause.
