APOSTLE ISLANDS August 18-23, 2024

SUNDAY, AUGUST 18 DAY 1

A wonderful Welcome Dinner will be enjoyed as a group before we overnight at the **Hampton Inn & Suites Chippewa Falls**.

MONDAY, AUGUST 19 DAY 2

After breakfast we will continue on toward Bayfield, WI, where the Northern Great Lakes Visitor Center will welcome us to the Great Lakes Region. The center is home to a museum that celebrates the history and heritage of Lake Superior. Head to the top of the five-story observation tower, take in the sights from the wildlife viewing platform, and explore the interpretive and historic exhibits. Lunch will be enjoyed as a group at a local restaurant before we head to Suri Fina Alpaca Farm for a tour and chance to interact with these furry and friendly creatures. Our day will come to an end at the **Legendary Waters Resort & Casino** for a three-night stay with the evening at our leisure.

BAYFIELD, WI

TUESDAY, AUGUST 20 DAY 3

BAYFIELD, WI (Breakfast, Dinner) Enjoy breakfast at the resort before we board the ferry for the ride to Madeline Island. Madeline Island is the largest of the Apostle Islands, and it is home to sandy beaches, an artistic spirit, and Ojibwe history. Upon our arrival on the island, we will make our way to the Madeline Island Museum to explore the stories of the diverse peoples who have called the island home. Four historic structures make up the heart of the museum and feature fascinating artifacts and engaging exhibits telling Ojibwe, French, British, and American stories. Free time will then be available to browse the speciality shops and galleries throughout town and enjoy lunch at one of the island's delicious dining options. We'll then return to the mainland by ferry to wander through the fascinating artifacts at Bayfield Maritime Museum focused on the dynamic nautical history of Bayfield and the Apostle Islands. We'll end our day with a delicious dinner.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 21

The Bayfield area is known for apples and berries, so today's adventure will begin with a tour of The Fruit Loop, the area's local farms, orchards, and wineries. Our first stop will be Hauser's Superior View Farm to sample the Apfelhaus Hard Cider, shop their wide selection of jellies and jams, and pick apples and berries that are in season. Stop number two is Bayfield Winery and Blue Ox Cider to sample their home-grown wines and ciders. We'll round out the tour at the **Bayfield Apple Company** where we can stroll through the orchard in search of butterflies, watch the cider-production process, and browse the local and regional gifts available in the shop. A picnic lunch awaits us here before we board a boat for the Apostle Island Grand Tour (subject to availability and scheduling). This narrated, fifty-five-mile scenic cruise showcases the twenty-one island archipelago's natural scenery, the beautiful Raspberry and Devils Island Lighthouses, extensive sea caves, and abundant marine wildlife. A fantastic Farewell Dinner awaits us back on land!

THURSDAY, AUGUST 22 DAY 5

MADISON, WI Following breakfast we will say goodbye to Bayfield and venture to Madison, WI, with stops for comfort and lunch on our own along the way. Here we'll take a tour of the beautiful Wisconsin State Capitol Building, which is a National Historic Landmark. Madison's Capitol Square is home to many shops, boutiques, and restaurants, and it is here where we will enjoy a delicious dinner.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 23 HOME DAY 6

This morning will begin with a guided tour of the Allen Centennial Gardens, an artful living laboratory and public botanical garden by the Horticulture Department at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. After lunch together, we will depart for home.
